Water Reclamation Facility

- SWD personnel have ordered two Aquajet floating aerators for the new digester/sludge holding basin. Confirmation has been received that these units have been shipped and I anticipate receipt within the next two weeks.
- Mike Cays has finished plumbing in the new turbidity analyser for the new reclaimed water filter and John Tucker of Straits Electric is wiring that unit into the system.
- Jay Griffith is painting the new piping for the reclaimed water filter and preparing to paint the new pre-eq basin pumphouse.
- We have yet to receive word from the Department of Ecology regarding comment on our Record Drawings or O&M Manuals.
- We still have an issue with Washington Labor and Industries concerning one of Ceccanti’s subcontractors. Ceccanti personnel are working on resolving that problem. We can’t pay the retainage to Ceccanti until we receive approval from those regulators.
- I consulted with WASWD legal counsel, John Carpita, regarding our issue with the new sludge digester.

Meter Setters

- Scott is installing water meter setters in Divisions 7, 11 and assorted missed individual residences.
- SWD personnel are installing water meters and setters in Division 7. The fourplex at 116 Hilltop has been completed.

Water Consumption Metering Results

- Readings from our water meters in all of Division 17 in SunLand for the last 30 days averaged **722** gallons per day. The average daily consumption, based on an annual average per connection, in SunLand is in the neighborhood of **200** gallons.
- The SG&CC facility has averaged **150** Gallons per day over the last 3 days, compared to a historical average daily consumption of approximately **1000** gallons.
- The static water level in the 250 foot well No. 1 averaged **83 feet** for July while the pumping water level for that well averaged **95 feet** for the same period.
- The static water level for the 129 foot well No.2 averaged **17 feet** for July while the pumping water level for that well averaged **24 feet** for the same period.

Other

- We have some of the water meter reading equipment and we are using it to read the meters for July consumption through-out Division 17.
- SWD will be testing the water at homes within SunLand for lead and copper again this month.
- The District is advertising for an office assistant/Billing Clerk again. Wallene has discovered that she really does want to be retired
