Water Reclamation Facility

- Ciccanti, Inc. of Tacoma began moving their equipment to the WRF on July 1. They moved in additional equipment and their construction trailer on July 7. After exposing the very bottom of the lagoon, it's looking like most if not all of the round rock ballast is quite contaminated and will have to be removed from the site. The contractor is also starting work on the new vault at the headworks. This is where the inflow will be automatically or manually directed to the pre-eq/overflow basin or to one of the two sequential batch reactor basins. A pre-construction meeting was conducted at the WRF on June 18th.
- Fire Mountain Farms personnel have completed the elements of their contract. In the event that additional biosolids have to be removed from the site those materials can be transported to Fire Mountain. There is money in the Ciccanti contract for that work.
- Troy Smith of Maple View Farm will be harvesting the hay crop again this week.
- The replacement pump unit for the main lift station has not yet arrived.
- SWD personnel are continuing to work on installing and connecting the second reclaimed water filter.

 Last but certainly not least: The SunLand WRF has received the "Wastewater Treatment Plant Outstanding Performance Award", again for 2013 from the Washington Department of Ecology. Water Consumption Metering Results

- Readings from our water meters on occupied single family residential lots in SunLand for the last 30 days averaged? Gallons per day. The average daily consumption, based on an annual average per connection, is 196 gallons.
- The SG&CC facility has averaged? Gallons per day over the last 30 days, compared to a historical average daily consumption of 1014 gallons.
