# **Franchise Agreement**

  - New Lead & Copper Rule

These are pretty much management changes, not additional monitoring or increased frequency. Test results must be included in CCR; more stringent waiver requirements; lead found in service lines must be replaced; DOH notice of new treatment methods or water sources.
