- The operators at the WRF have been making repairs to the main control panel.
- Rich has been preparing for the level II Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Exam.
- Willy and Rich will be attending a Lab Accreditation class this Thursday in Renton.
- The new sludge truck has gone in for its annual service.

# **Water Meters/Meter Setters**

• Scott has just completed the 13th water meter read for all of SunLand. The next water meter read is planned for the first week in April.

#### **Water Production/Consumption Results**

- Static water levels in the groundwater wells are normal for winter.
- Total water production in February of 2019 from both sources was 3,341,392 gallons, for a total water production in 2019 of 5,776,714 gallons.

#### Other

- Mike Langley will be participating in a WASWD workshop about the removal of Pharmaceuticals and Personal Care Products (PPCP's) from the wastewater stream. The workshop will take place at the WASWSD offices in Tukwila.
- SWD personnel continue to search for a replacement backhoe. The old unit
  we have was inherited from the developer, has safety issues, and is far
  beyond its useful life.
- SWD personnel are continuing work on improvements to the water shop and barn as time permits.
- SWD personnel were able to make repairs on the 2003 Ford Ranger truck. This success saved the District more than \$20,000.00 to replace that vehicle.
- SWD personnel are continuing to contact customers whose water consumption has been significantly higher than the average for SunLand. Higher than average consumption readings may be an indication of a water leak. Some irrigation systems are showing consumption even though they have been turned off which indicates a leak exists. SWD has notified the owners of this discovery.

- SWD personnel responded to a broken irrigation line on Arnold Palmer. The water was shut off while the owner's agent made repairs.
- SWD personnel repaired a water line leak on Madigan Road.
- SWD personnel assisted with a sewer line repair on Turnagain Place.
- SWD personnel responded to a high water pressure concern at Ascot Court. The homeowner was advised to replace a pressure reducing valve at that address.
- Straits Electric will be performing testing and maintenance on all District emergency generators.
