



Commissioner's Meeting February 17, 2026

MANAGERS' REPORT BY ROBERT WHALEN

Water Reclamation Facility

- Nailed IT Construction has started tearing off the old shingles at the treatment plant and has had to replace a few pieces of plywood to have a strong structural foundation.
- Angeles Electric has started electrical work on the new building.
- Have been in contact with High Tech Security. Will have two motion sensors and a door alarm installed as soon as electrical work has been completed
- Have completed 1 year's worth of logging Lift Station run times into Excel spreadsheet. Working on getting the crew in the barn access to the server so that they can enter information.
- Willy has ordered a new turbidimeter to replace the current one that is in place. This is a crucial piece of equipment that is needed to meet permit parameters. We will send in the old one to see if we can have it fixed and on the shelf as backup.
- Rich and David attended that ERWOW conference in Ridgefield WA last week.

Water

- As a result of having the best tasting water in Washington, Scott was able to attend the Rural Water Rally in Washington D.C. Unfortunately, our water did not make the top 5 but Scott had a great experience meeting and talking with all the Senators!
- Rocky and Dave have been out listening to fire hydrants. They have found one that was quite loud (leaking). After some routine exercise, hydrant has returned to a quiet state. This would have added to the 11% water loss last month.
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- Crew was recently made aware of a water leak at 179 Sunset Pl. Currently, we do not know if it is a service line leak or a main line leak.
- Met with a rep from Frontier Precision on a Gis device on 1/30/2026. I have purchased a device that is best suited for our needs, and we will start working on this project once device has been received.
- Have been in contact with Ed Mola about upper reservoir pump replacement. Upper reservoir work was postponed due to an injury within crew. I was assured that work will be done before irrigation season starts. No update currently.
- I have completed logging 1 years' worth of reservoir and well pump run times in to an Excel spreadsheet and again working on getting the crew access to server.
- Water loss for the month of January was 6%, 5% lower than in December. Static levels for January rest at 92.8 ft, while the pumping levels are at 118.7 ft.
